We have compiled some useful information to help you get the most of your new candle and enjoy it for as long as possible.

Our candles are made from eco soya wax with cotton wicks. Using thoughtfully blended fragrances and the finest ingredients including luxurious essential oils and delicate fragrance oils. The level of the perfume in the wax is as high as the manufacturing process will allow.

Always ensure the first burn is for approximately 2 hours. This should be sufficient time to create a wax pool that covers the surface of the candle and will stop "tunnelling" from occurring. Trim candlewicks to ¼ inch each time before burning. Long or crooked wicks can cause uneven burning and dripping

Keep burning candles away from drafts, vents, ceiling fans and air currents. This will help prevent rapid, uneven burning, and avoid flame flare-ups and sooting. Drafts can also blow nearby lightweight items into the flame where they could catch fire.

Always keep a burning candle within sight. Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or before going to sleep. Be sure the wick ember is no longer glowing.

Never burn a candle on or near anything that can catch fire. Keep burning candles away from furniture, drapes, bedding, carpets, books, paper, flammable decorations, etc

Keep burning candles out of the reach of children and pets

Be sure the candle-holder is placed on a stable, heat-resistant surface. Please note that your fine bone china votive will become hot whilst the candle is lit - do not touch when in use.

Keep the wax pool free of wick trimmings, matches and debris at all times

Always burn candles in a well-ventilated room. Don't burn too many candles in a small room or in a "tight" home where air exchange is limited.

Don't burn a candle all the way down. Extinguish the flame if it comes too close to the holder or container. For a margin of safety, discontinue burning a candle when half an inch is left in a container candle. **NEVER** expose the metal sustainers

Never touch or move a burning candle or container candle when the wax is liquid Never use a knife or sharp object to remove wax drippings from a glass holder. It might scratch, weaken, or cause the votive to break upon subsequent use

Place burning candles at least three inches apart from one another. This helps ensure they don't melt one another, or create their own drafts to cause improper burning

Use a snuffer to extinguish a candle. It's the safest way to prevent hot wax splatters

Never extinguish candles with water. The water can cause the hot wax to splatter and might cause a class container to break

Extinguish a candle if it repeatedly smokes, flickers, or the flame becomes too high. The candle isn't burning properly. Cool, trim the wick, then check for drafts before relighting

Never use a candle as a night light

NEVER burn a candle for longer than 3 hours. Be aware that if a candle burns too long and gets too hot, it can cause issues with glues that have been used for labelling and could cause them to ignite

Once your candle has finished you will be left with a stunning fine bone china votive which is reuseable.
